CHALLENGES

- To link more effectively the curriculum with learning experiences outdoor
- Farms are a source of potential learning not yet sufficiently valorised
- Learning activities regarding agriculture or food education are not well structured (one shot).
- Farmers and teachers do not speak the same language when it comes to pedagogy.





Objectives

The general objective of DEMETER is to improve the quality of school education through an increased collaboration between schools and farms.


SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

1. To increase the integration of farm/food-related experiences in the school curriculum in the framework of a wider path of education toward food, respect for the environment and health

2. To improve the competences of school teachers and operators in the agricultural business by exchanging, consolidating and developing teaching methodologies

3. To create synergies among the actors of the community (schools, local authorities, business and researchers) for the improvement of school education

- Improved coordination and collaboration between teachers in different subjects
- Raised awareness in decision makers






