



OBJECTIVE: to protect and enhance the natural heritage of protected areas, promoting an innovative model of sustainable tourism planning, based on a participatory planning approach inspired by the criteria contained in the **European** Charter for Sustainable Tourism



Central Eco Tourism 2017-2020



The <u>participatory</u> <u>approach</u> aims to:

- reduce land use conflicts
- support social and territorial cohesion
- improve the quality of life of local communities
- encourage the tourism sector to actively contribute to nature conservation



Nr. 3 out of 8 pilot actions in protected natural parks whose common element was the presence of a diversified tourist flow which is not always aware of the value and fragility of the protected areas themselves

ECST - European Charter for Sustainable Tourism



It is a voluntary methodological tool allowing sustainable tourism management in protected areas.

The European Charter for Sustainable Tourism is awarded to Protected Areas by the EUROPARC Federation through an independent verification process

The recognition, which has international value, is not only a commitment to improve sustainable tourism, but also the implementation of concrete actions carried out by public and private entities

- brings measurable economic, social and environmental benefits from well-managed sustainable tourism
- strengthens relationships with local tourism operators and the wider tourism industry
- provides access to and membership of an extensive and dynamic European network





Cervia Salt pan

It is included in Po Delta Park of Emilia-Romagna Region, is considered as Site of community importance (D.M. 65/00), Ramsar zone for the protection of wild birds (D.M. 13/7/81) and Natural reserve for animals (D.M. 31/1/79)

- 827 hectares of extension
- It counts more than 310 species of birds, 100 out of which are protected like flamingos
- Since 1979 it has been a State Nature Reserve of animal populations
- Presence of a Visitor Center providing support and information to visitors, promoting dissemination and educational activities, organizing and managing excursions and guided tours

Objectives for a sustainable tourist-recreational

use

Development of quality environmental tourism for the seasonal adjustment of tourism in Cervia based on areas of naturalistic value e landscape such as that of the Salt pan

Further development of the tourist activity needs to be planned and developed in balance with ecosystem dynamics e minimizing human impact

Increase in visits linked to diversification of the offer in terms of itineraries, accommodation facilities and dedicated activities, needs specific regulations according to criteria and methods defined on the basis of estimation of the load capacity, in order not to negatively affect the state of conservation of habitats and target species



Access gates and Signs

2 projects carried out in collaboration with the Local Action Group Delta 2000, both financed under the Area Leader Rural Development Plan:

- 1. construction of 11 <u>access gates</u> to the Delta Park which, given the absence of borders that delimit the territory, materially identify where the regional protected area begins.
- 1. improvement of the existing <u>signs</u> by replacing the old or no longer current ones and the installation of additional signs identifying the areas of greatest interest from an environmental point of view
